Paws & More Animal Shelter is a private, non-profit, adoption -guarantee shelter serving all residents of Washington County. The Shelter takes in approximately 600 animal each year, with a high adoption rate, that spays/neuters, vaccinates, and behaviorally tests all animals before adoption. The Shelter is always in need of volunteer and foster homes, and operates primarily from adoption fees, donations, grants and fundraising activities, receiving only a small portion of the annual budget from city/county government donations. Who We Are:

- For more than 40 years, PAWS & More has <u>provided animals with shelter</u> and compassionate care in Washington County and the surrounding areas.
- We've grown from serving 400 animals a year to over 1,000 animals a year, with a need for serving even more.

What We're Doing, and Why:

- We recently learned that our foundation has deteriorated to the point that our aging building isn't worth the major cost to repair it.
- We are undertaking our largest-ever fundraising endeavor, because we believe a new facility is the most fiscally and organizationally responsible solution.
- A modern facility will allow us to practice the most current, safe, and effective methods of animal care. Moving from 4,000 to 8,000 square feet will allow for:
 - appropriate isolation of sick animals
 - excellent drainage for disease control
 - a storm shelter
 - adequate storage
 - an enclosed garage for the safe unloading of stray animals
- A larger building also allows us to serve the growing needs of our region.

Where We're Going, and When:

- We're looking for a 2-3 acre property in Washington County.
- Our goal is to break ground in July 2024, and we expect construction to take 12 months.
