69.10 SNOW EMERGENCY PARKING POLICY After snowfalls of 3" or more, the snow emergency policy requires odd/even parking on designated snow routes for the first 24 hours in correlation with the day of the month. Even numbered days park on the even (house number) side of the street. The parking will alternate until the snow has stopped and all streets are cleared. The city also has "Snow Emergency" routes where no parking is allowed until all snow has been removed. The City has the right, power, and authority to determine the length of time that parking is not allowed on the streets for snow removal. Vehicles violating the restrictions will be subject to a ticket, minimum \$25.00 fine, and possible towed.

135.12 DUMPING OF SNOW It is unlawful for any person to push snow or ice from private property onto the city street, alley, or sidewalk.

136.03 REMOVAL OF SNOW, ICE AND ACCUMULATIONS. It is the responsibility of the abutting property owners to remove snow, ice and accumulations from sidewalks within 48 hours. If this has not been done within 24 hours, an attempt will be made by City staff to contact the property owner. If the contact attempt is unsuccessful, or the sidewalk has not been cleared, a notice will be posted on the door of the address giving 24 hours from the date of the door posting to remove the snow. If the sidewalk is not cleared 24 hours after the door posting, the City will contract to have the snow removed and the cost for removal will be billed to the property owner. The property owner has thirty days from the date of the billing to remit payment. Any bills left unpaid will become a lien against the property. This

ordinance pertains to residential and commercial property.

Commercial properties located along Highway 22 between Greene and Washburn should have the upper sidewalk portion in front of their property cleared of snow by 8:00 a.m. following the snowfall. Snow may be pushed to the lower sidewalk. City crews will remove the snow from the lower sidewalk and parking. If snow is not removed by 8:00 a.m., it is the responsibility of the property owner to push the snow to the end of street and not push it onto the cleared lower sidewalk. City staff will be responsible for clearing the stairs.

The eight foot sidewalk located on the east side of Ella Street from 2nd Street to Blackberry will be maintained by the City of Riverside.
