Library - The City of Riverside contracts with the Kalona Public Library for library services. Residents can obtain a library card with a photo ID with a Riverside address at no charge. This Library card will also allow you to use library services at Coralville and Iowa City.

Paws & More Animal Shelter is a private, non-profit, adoption-guarantee shelter serving all residents of Washington County. The Shelter takes in approximately 600 animal each year, with a high adoption rate, that spays/neuters, vaccinates, and behaviorally tests all animals before adoption. The Shelter is always in need of volunteers and foster homes, and operates primarily from adoption fees, donations, grants and fundraising activities, receiving only a small portion of the annual budget from city/county government donations. Please consider designating a recurring donation of any amount to your water bill by filling out the form located on our website under **Government → Resources → Forms → Paws & More Monthly Donation Form** and returning to City Hall.

REMINDER: Water bills are mailed at the end of each month and are due by the 15th of the following month. If the 15th falls on a weekend, payment is due on the next business day. Customers may enroll in automatic payment at no cost. Enrollment forms are available on our website under **Government → Resources → Forms → ACH Bill Pay Form**, or in person at City Hall. To avoid late fees, please contact City Hall prior to the 15th of each month for additional payment options.

Please do not reuse your water bill envelope to mail your payment. This results in an extra postage due charge to the City. The postage due will be charged back to your account.
