**Snow Removal** – It is the responsibility of the property owner to remove snow, ice and accumulations from sidewalks within 48 hours. It is unlawful to push snow or ice from sidewalks from private property onto any city street, alley or sidewalk.

## Snow Emergency Explained

The City may declare a Snow Emergency when 3" or more of snowfall is expected. When this happens...

Snow Emergency Parking Restrictions go into effect (see below) and parking violations increase to \$25 per occurrence. - *Riverside City Code 69.10*

### Streets with Snow Emergency Route Signs

Street-wide No Parking in effect until Snow Emergency is lifted.

### All Other Streets

Odd Days: No parking on the side of the street with odd addresses.

Example: January 17<sup>th</sup> or 19<sup>th</sup>

Even Days: No parking on the side of the street with even addresses.

Example: January 18<sup>th</sup> or 20<sup>th</sup>

\*No Parking areas will still be enforced\*

\*Public parking spaces with painted lines  
are exempt from these restrictions\*
