City of Riverside CODE OF ORDINANCE reminders to citizens:

51.02 Does not allow for inoperable vehicle on property.

51.01 Does not allow storing certain items outside on your property.

55.03 Dogs must be on leash while in City Limits. Owners must remove animal feces from lawns, parks, trail, and City ROW.

105.05 No burning of trash within City Limits.

135.03 No grass clippings on City Streets. This causes back-up of storm sewer.

151.03 Trimming trees over sidewalk and street.

165.06 Overgrown weeds or lawn.
