The Riverside City Council meeting opened at 6:31 pm in City Hall with Mayor Allen Schneider requesting roll call. Council members present were: Tom Sexton, Andy Rodgers, Jeanine Redlinger, Bob Schneider Jr., and Edgar McGuire.

Motion by Sexton to approve the agenda, Second by Schneider, passed 5-0.

Rodgers moved to approve the minutes of January 7^{th} and expenditures. Second by Redlinger, passed 5-0.

Phil Richman expressed concerns about sidewalks not cleaned off on Windstream property.

Bill Stukey, PeopleService, Inc. presented December water and waste water report.

Schneider moved to pass Resolution #012119-01; Approving contract renewal with PeopleService, Inc. for FY 19-20. Contract reflects 2.2% CPI-U increase. Second by Redlinger, passed 5-0.

FINANCIAL PLANNING AGREEMENT

BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY OF RIVERSIDE, IOWA AND NORTHLAND SECURITIES, INC.

ONGOING FINANCIAL PLANNING

This Agreement made and entered into by and between the City of Riverside, Iowa (hereinafter "CITY") and Northland Securities, Inc., of Minneapolis, Minnesota (hereinafter "NSI").

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the CITY desires to use the services of NSI for financial planning assistance related to planning for the funding of future capital improvement projects.

WHEREAS, the advice rendered by NSI is intended solely for financial planning purposes. NSI is not providing advice or any recommendation on the timing, terms, structure or similar matters related to a specific bond issue. The financial planning services provided by NSI do not create a relationship, direct or implied, related to the issuance of municipal securities that may result from this planning.

WHEREAS, NSI desires to furnish services to the CITY as hereinafter described.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is agreed by and between the parties as follows:

SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED BY NSI

The proposed scope of work is designed to help city staff manage ongoing strategic financial planning issues included in the basic services below.

BASIC SERVICES

The proposal is based on a core service package with optional services that can be added at the discretion of the CITY. As a part of this core service package, NSI will attend one meeting per quarter including City Council meetings and other meetings with City officials as necessary to carry out the services described below.

TASK 1 - URBAN RENEWAL PLANNING PROJECTS

Objectives of the capital improvement planning will include the following:

- Complete analysis of City's Urban Renewal Area
- Identify funding needs based upon the City's planned urban renewal projects.
- Identify funding parameters for urban renewal projects.
- Perform analysis of future expected Tax Increment Revenues.

TASK 2 – DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT

NSI will work with City officials to answer questions and perform tax increment revenue analysis related to the proposed agreement for the City's new housing development. Services will include:

- Tax Increment Revenue analysis.
- Discussions with City and Bond Counsel related to the creation of the Agreement.

TASK 3 - URBAN RENEWAL REPORTS

NSI will work with City staff to complete the necessary urban renewal reports before the December 1st deadline. NSI expects to be actively involved in completing the reports for two years and consult as needed in future years. The reports include the following:

- Debt Certification report to the County Auditor.
- Urban Renewal Report to be submitted to Iowa Department of Management.

TASK 4-UPDATING UTILITY RATE STUDY

A utility rate study will include the following:

- Analysis of current rate structure including cash flow analysis.
- Presentation of cash flow analysis and recommendation of rate structure changes as needed to cover operation and maintenance costs, capital improvement cost, and debt service payments.

TASK 5 - UPDATING CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

Objectives of the capital improvement planning will include the following:

- Identify funding needs based upon the City's planned projects.
- Perform analysis of future expected revenues including casino revenues and other general revenues of the City.
- Evaluate options for overall capital improvement funding plan by developing scenarios,
 varying the approach, timing and other key project variables.
- Update long term funding plan for current and future capital improvement projects.

ADDITIONAL SERVICES

The CITY may authorize NSI to provide additional planning services as the projects require. The tasks described in the agreement present the tasks that NSI expects to perform. NSI will provide a written scope of work and budget for all additional services.

COMPENSATION

NSI will provide the services described in this proposal for a lump sum fee of \$1,500 each quarter beginning January 1, 2019. NSI agrees to pay the following expenses from its fee:

Out-of-pocket expenses such as travel, long distance phone, and copy costs.

The City agrees to pay for all other expenses related to the processing of the rate study including, but not limited to, the following:

- City staff expenses.
- Accounting and other related fees.

ASSIGINED NORTHLAND EMPLOYEE

The NSI employee responsible for providing services pursuant to this agreement and for the services performed is Michael Hart.

SUCCESSORS OR ASSIGNS

The terms and provisions of this Agreement are binding upon and inure to the benefit of the CITY and NSI and their successors or assigns.

DISCLAIMER

In performing service under this agreement, NSI is relying on the accuracy of information provided by the CITY and the services provided by NSI are based on current State Law. The parties agree that the Iowa property tax system and other laws may change and may affect the accuracy and validity of services provided by NSI. NSI will perform its work using the best available information. The CITY recognizes and accepts that future growth, property values, tax increment revenues, tax levies and tax rates may vary from the assumptions used by NSI and such changes may affect the work product produced and provided by NSI.

TERM OF THIS AGREEMENT

This Agreement may be terminated by thirty (30) days written notice by either the CITY or NSI. In the event of early termination by the CITY, NSI shall provide the CITY with an itemized statement of services already provided. The agreement shall be in effect for one year.

28E Agreement Regarding Maintenance of Roads and Streets within the City's Corporate Limits

This agreement made and entered into by and between the City of Keota, Iowa, hereinafter referred to as the City, and Washington County, Iowa hereinafter referred to as the County.

In accord with Chapter 28E, 314.5 and other relevant sections of the Code of Iowa, the City and the County enter into the following agreement in order to define the duties and responsibilities of each party regarding the maintenance, repair and minor reconstruction of the roads and streets located within the City's corporate limits.

- 1. The County and the City mutually desire to reach an equitable decision as to functions to be performed and the financial responsibility of each party concerning construction and maintenance of roads and streets. As a general rule the County will be responsible for the center 22 feet of roadway and the City will be responsible for the right of way outside the center 22 feet of roadway.
- 2. The roads and streets to be included within the scope of this agreement shall be as shown on the attached map which shall become a part of this agreement and shall be described as follows:
 - A. <u>Keokuk-Washington Road</u> (secondary road extension of County V-15) beginning at the East Quarter Corner of Section 25-76-10 thence north along the East line of the NE Quarter of said Section 25 and the East line of the SE Quarter of Section 24-76-10 to the NE Corner of the SE Quarter of the SE Quarter of said Section 24 all lying in Keokuk County and including that portion beginning fifty feet north of the SW Corner of the NW Quarter of the NW Quarter of Section 30-76-9 thence North along the West line of the Northwest Quarter of Section 30-76-9 to the Northwest Corner of Section 30-76-9 all lying in Washington County.
 - B. 200th Street (secondary road extension of 200th Street) the south half of this street beginning at the NW1/4 of Section 30, Township 76 North, Range 9 West of the 5th P.M. thence east 0.5 miles to the East corporation line of the City of Keota, Iowa.
- 3. Responsibilities for maintenance of roads and streets under this agreement will be as follows:
 - A. County responsibilities for Keokuk-Washington Road and 200th Street as listed in Paragraph 2:
 - 1. Pavement and Surfacing: Maintain and repair the center 22 feet of the roadway.
 - 2. Traffic Services: Provide regulatory and warning signing on the roads and streets as well as stop signs on appropriate streets that intersect the roadway. Provide pavement marking for traffic lanes on the center 22 feet of roadway, if required.
 - 3. Drainage: Maintain clear surface drainage to and through drainage structures (except storm sewers) within the center 22 feet of the roadway.
 - 4. Winter Maintenance: Plow and treat pavement and bridges within the center 22 feet of roadway pursuant to Washington County policy. Plowed snow will be deposited alongside the roadway and Washington County will not be responsible for the removal of this snow.
 - 5. Vehicular Bridges: Perform structural maintenance as necessary and inspection and posting according to National Bridge Inspection Standards.

- 6. Maintain and repair guardrail, pavement shoulders and edge rutting pursuant to the County Policy.
- B. City of Keota responsibilities for Keokuk-Washington Road and 200th Street as listed in Paragraph 2.

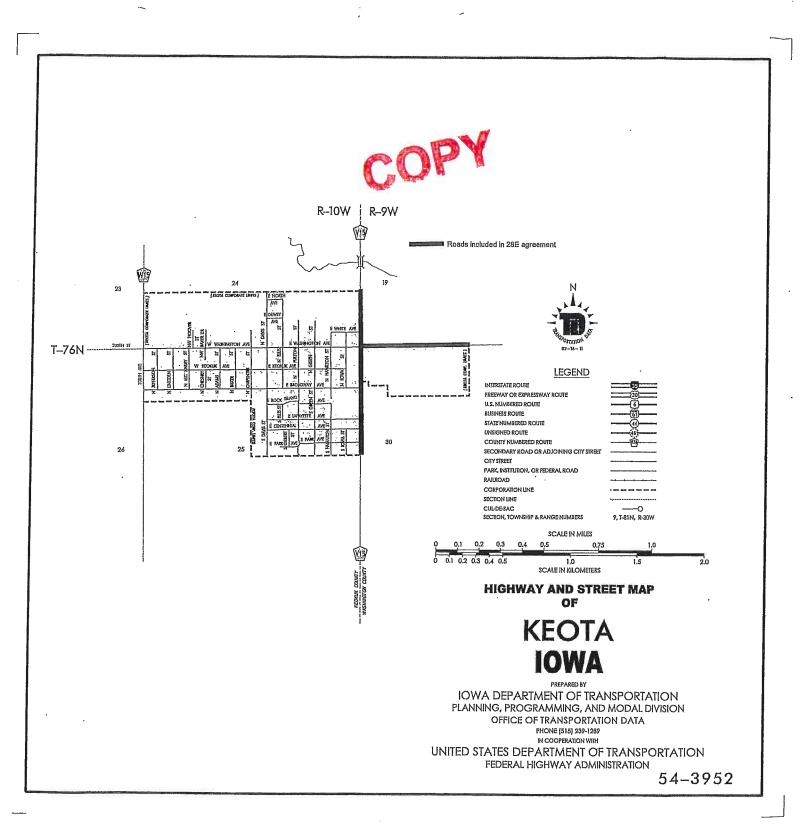
1. Pavement and Surfacing: Maintain and repair outside the center 22 feet of the roadway. Maintain and repair the center 22 feet of the roadway at new utility cuts.

- 2. Traffic Services: Paint stop lines and crosswalks at streets intersecting the roads and street if required. Paint parking stalls and maintain any other traffic marking located outside the center 22 feet of the roadway. Maintain, repair and provide energy to traffic signals and street lighting.
- 3. Drainage: Maintain and repair storm sewers, manholes, intakes and catch basins used for collection and disposal of surface drainage.
- 4. Winter Maintenance: Clear from all areas outside the center 22 feet of the roadway as well as from sidewalks as per City policy.
- 5. Maintain right of way outside enter 2 feet of roadway including sidewalks as per City policy.
- 6. Clean, sweep and wash streets when considered necessary by the City.
- 7. Remove trees as necessary.
- 4. All traffic control devices shall conform to the "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices." Washington County shall establish speed limits in consultation with the City and on the basis of an engineering and traffic investigation.
- 5. The County and City further agree:
 - A. To prevent erection or encroachment of any private signs within or overhanging the right of way, that could obstruct the view of any traffic control devices or any portion of the roadway or as per Section 318 of the Code of Iowa.
 - B. To comply with all current statutes and regulations pertaining to overlength and overweight vehicles using the County roads.
 - C. To comply with Washington County's utility policy by requiring a Washington County permit for any construction or maintenance within the right of way.
 - D. To comply with Washington County's access control policy by requiring a County permit for any change to an existing entrance or for the construction of a new entrance.
 - E. That any damage settlement for the roadway caused by Iowa DOT detours or haul Roads shall be negotiated with the Iowa DOT by Washington County and paid to Washington County.
 - F. That the City shall pay any Drainage District Assessments levied against the roadway within the City.
 - G. That any major construction initiated by either party shall be covered by a separate agreement. Major construction may include pavement resurfacing, rehabilitation or reconstruction as well as repair or replacement of vehicular bridges.
 - H. That each party shall provide, without reimbursement, any existing right of way within their respective jurisdiction that is necessary for construction or maintenance.
 - I. That the City retains ownership of any underground utilities that are currently within their jurisdiction.
- 6. Each party will entirely finance any obligation that is undertaken herein. No real or personal property acquired by either party will be subject to this agreement.

- 7. The Washington County Engineer shall administer this agreement as per Section 28E.6 of the Code of Iowa and in consultation with the Boards of Supervisors and the City Council.
- 8. This agreement shall not prohibit either party from employing a private contractor to perform work associated with this agreement.
- 9. In consideration of the duties outlined in this agreement, the City will pay the County a percentage of the Street Construction Fund that is received from the State of Iowa each fiscal year. The percentage used for payment will be the total percentage of roads within the City that the Keokuk Washington Road and 200th Street account for when looking at the total mileage of roads within the City. This payment shall be made annually in June during the last payment cycle of the current fiscal year this agreement is in effect.
- 10. This agreement shall be in effect until July 1, 2017 and will therein be automatically renewed every July 1 for a period of one year unless terminated sooner as provided in Paragraph 11.
- 11. Any party may terminate this agreement upon written notice to the other parties not later than January 10th of a given year. Said termination may occur to earlier than July 1st following the notice.
- 12. Each party is responsible for liability occurring as a result of the acts or omissions in performing its obligations under this agreement. The City shall protect, indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the County for acts or omissions of the City, its officers, employees, agents, and assigns with respect to the obligations of the City under this agreement. The County shall protect, indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the City for acts or omissions of the County, its officers, employees, agents, and assigns with respect to the obligations of the County under this agreement.
- 13. This agreement is effective upon filing and recording as required by law.

Capital Projects Funding Recommendations

- 1. Make customary transfer to capital projects including:
 - a. \$880,000 from Casino Fund
 - b. \$250,000 from General Fund
 - c. \$63,000 from LOST fund
 - d. \$18,900 from Storm Water Fund
- 2. Include revenue from sale of lots on Cherry Lane and Galileo Drive
- 3. Include revenue from Safe Routes to School Grant
- 4. Transfer \$500,000 from casino fund in addition to annual \$880,000
 - a. See Casino revenue cash flow for explanation
- 5. Transfer \$350,000 from water fund
- 6. Transfer \$80,000 from Road Use Tax Fund
- 7. Transfer \$515,000 from general fund in addition to annual \$250,000 for a total transfer of \$765,000 in FY 2020.

Funding Plan Results

- A. With no borrowing, funding will be about \$418,000 short by year end FY 2020 with current projects (See orange highlight on funding page).
 - a. Need to push some project money into follow year to avoid borrowing.
- B. Most available fund balances will be substantially spent down. Balances should not go below comfort level but opportunity for similar large transfers in future years will be limited. The one exception is the funds set aside for the community building.
- C. City will have approximately \$1,200,000 for capital projects each year going forward after FY 2020. This assumes funding from Casino, LOST, Storm Sewer and General Funds annually (See blue highlight on funding page). Grants and other funding sources could increase this amount.
