The Riverside City Council meeting opened at 6:30 pm in City Hall with Mayor Allen Schneider requesting roll call. Council members present were: Tom Sexton, Andy Rodgers, Bob Schneider Jr., Edgar McGuire, and Jeanine Redlinger.

Motion by Sexton to approve the agenda, Second by Schneider, passed 5-0.

Rodgers moved to approve the minutes of February $18^{\rm th}$, and expenditures. Second by Redlinger, passed 5-0.

Schneider moved to open Public Hearing for Northern Heights Annexation at 6:40 pm. Second by Redlinger, passed 5-0.

Marge Schnoebelen urged Council to consider installing turning lanes for the development as Tupelo is a "farm to market road". There were no other written or oral comments.

Sexton moved to close Public Hearing at 6:42 pm. Second by Redlinger, passed 5-0.

Redlinger moved to pass Resolution #030419-01; Approving Voluntary annexation of Yeggy Roetlin Farms, LLC. known as Northern Height Subdivision. Second by Schneider, passed 5-0.

Sexton moved to open Public Hearing for rezoning Northern Heights Subdivision at 6:45 pm. Second by Redlinger, passed 5-0. There were no written or oral comments.

Schneider moved to close Public Hearing at 6:46 pm. Second by Redlinger, passed 5-0.

Schneider moved to adopt Ordinance #030419-02; Rezoning Yeggy Roetlin Farms LLC. Parcel (1) from A-1 Agriculture to R-2 Mixed Residential, and Parcel (2) from A-1 Agriculture to R-3 Multifamily Residential. Second by Redlinger, passed 5-0.

Schneider moved to waive 2nd and 3rd Ordinance readings. Second by Redlinger, passed 5-0.

Schneider moved to pass Resolution #030419-03; Approving Preliminary Plat for Northern Heights Subdivision. Second by Rodgers, passed 5-0.

Sexton moved to Open Public Hearing for Adopting FY19-20 Annual City Budget at 6:51 pm. Second by Redlinger, passed 5-0. Mayor read e-mail submitted by Kevin Kiene. There were no other written or oral comments. McGuire moved to close Public Hearing at 6:52 pm. Second by Sexton, passed 5-0.

Schneider moved to pass Resolution #030419-04; Adopting the annual City Budget for Fiscal Year July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020. Second by Rodgers, passed 5-0.

Chad Smothers, Riverside Fire Chief presented Annual Fire District report for 2018.

Rodgers moved to approve Galileo Drive Covenants, as provide by City Attorney. Second by Sexton, passed 5-0.

Scott Pottorff, MMS Consultants updated Council on Northern Heights Construction plans.

Pottorff is compiling specifications for completing curb and gutter on east end of Hwy 22 from Schnoebelen Street to East Street. Storm drainage will be removed, and replaced with curb, gutter, and side walk. This will be added to project as a change order.

Rodgers moved to approve project plans for Tupelo Blvd. Second by McGuire, passed 5-0.

Rodgers moved to pass Resolution 3030419-06 Setting date of Public Hearing for Ash/Tupelo project on March 18, 2019 at City Council meeting beginning at 6:30 pm. Second by McGuire, passed 5-0.

City will hold a public informational meeting for the Ash/Tupelo project on March 13, 2019 at 6:00 pm with MMS Consultants. Notice will be posted with home owners affected by project.

Mayor explained his "Letter of Support" for Automated Driving Systems Demonstration Grant to the US Dept. of Transportation.

Council reviewed LED lighting proposal for City Hall. Clerk will check into additional bids.

O & M Report: February 2019

Water Operation & Maintenance

- Coby and I performed annual preventive maintenance and oil changes on all the high service pumps.
- Coby and I greased all the pumps for the reverse osmosis at the water plant.
- Pump 1 for RO skid 1 has a small seal leak. We will purchase a new seal and install when it arrives. Skid 1 is still operational with the leak.
- Coby found the anti-scale pump to be leaking. I found there was a tear in the diaphragm and not allowing it to pump. I rebuilt the pump and replaced the diaphragm. Pump is back in service and operational.
- > I replaced two 3-way valves on RO skid 2 and 3 second stage side. The valves were leaking and found to have a small crack in both.
- RO skid 1 is currently down for a ruptured burst disk. A new burst disk is ordered and should arrive in the first week of March. The rupture was caused from a hard shutdown of the plant due to a no flow condition of the anti-scale. The no flow was caused by the torn diaphragm.
- 6 door postings and 1 disconnect for non-payment were completed.
- 2 locates were completed.
- Unable to provide a water loss report for this month due to an error in the billing system.

Wastewater Operation & Maintenance


Riverside Casino notified me on 2-28-19 of a discharge of glycol from their cooling system. Kurt
 Lebsack stated that approximately 75 gallons of diluted Wintrex was discharged to the city sewer



system due to a failed pump that leaked on 2-27-19. The mix was 22% Ethylene Glycol and 68% water. According to the SDS the product is biodegradable but advised to not discharge to any sanitary sewer. I do not expect any impact on at the wastewater plant or to the casino lift station. Kurt has provided me with a written report of the incident for documentation.




