



Water Operation & Maintenance

- RO train 2 had a low suction alarm. I investigated what is causing this and I believe well #7 screen is fouling and getting plugged. I spoke to Cahoy Well and Pump, they recommend pulling the well and doing an inspection. They are sending me the cost estimate for this and plan on doing in July.
- > We replaced an 8" schedule 80 T at the water plant. The joint was beginning to leak and we replaced it before there was a complete failure.
- One of the chlorine pumps had some scaling around a check valve causing the valve to stay open and not prime. We disassembled and cleaned the pump and check valves. This unit is functioning properly again. We usually have to clean these chlorine pumps twice a year.
- We had a water leak outside at the water plant. We originally had Boyse Excavating come dig so we could make the repairs but found the water main was around thirteen feet deep and had concrete around the pipe. We had Carter and Associates come later and make the repairs for us due to the depth, the concrete, and restrictions of the dig area on REC's access road. Carters was able to dig and repair the leaking main. We found the water lines on the original plans are not how they were actually installed. The line that was leaking was supposed to be the main feed line to fill the tower from the plant, but the line is just a stub line that is capped for a possible expansion of development.
- We have dug and replaced a leaking hydrant at Railroad Park. This line is 1 ¼" schedule 40 PVC. The line runs through the park and services the concession restrooms, lift station 3 and the VFW. We may look to separate some of these if we replace the water main along Railroad St.


- > We sprayed weeds around the wastewater plant and ponds.
- We have started collecting bids to rehab lift station 1. We are planning to propose we replace the electric panel and both pumps at this station. The station was built around 1993 and is the most troublesome and cost incurring station we have. Many of the components in the panel are wearing out and the station is becoming cost prohibitive to continue making repairs on.
- The wastewater plant has started calling daily with an alarm for the effluent valve failing to close.


 Upon inspection the valve is functioning properly, but the indicator is having a delay showing it is fully closed. This is not causing any issues with the operations of the plant, but is causing a nuisance alarm situation. We are looking as to what is causing this and how to correct, we may have Jetco look into the situation.


